



## 2006 Zinfandel • Paso Robles

In 1999, Estancia planted nearly 700 acres along the Estrella River benchland in Paso Robles. This emerging region is ideal for producing Zinfandel grapes with complex and delicious fruit flavors displaying notes of intense raspberry and dark cherry.

Growing conditions in Paso Robles are extreme – temperature swings are greater here than in any other California appellation. The rugged landscape, unique microclimate and infertile soils at Keyes Canyon Vineyard produce red varieties with low yields, small clusters, tiny berries and high skin-to-juice ratios for concentrated wines with intense varietal character.

The 2006 Estancia Zinfandel from Keyes Canyon Vineyard in Paso Robles is a juicy, lively, medium-bodied red wine. Perfect for sipping in the company of good friends and good food or for cellaring over the next five years.



Appearance	Deep garnet, crimson hue
Aroma	Hints of dark berries, red plum, cocoa bean, nutmeg and vanilla fill the nose.
Flavor	Ripe boysenberry and black cherry are accented by notes of dark chocolate and cinnamon. Soft hints of creamy vanilla accompany the lingering finish.
